

FACT sheet

Here you can find answers to the 16 most frequently asked questions about our underground construction site tours:

- + How much time do I need to allow for the tour?
 - A tunnel tour lasts around 2 hours.
- + How much does the tour cost?
 - It is a free guided tour of the construction site.
- + Where does the tour start?
 - The tour starts at the BBT Tunnel Worlds InfoCentre in Steinach.
- + How can I book a guided tour of the construction site?

- +How big can the groups be?
 - We generally offer our construction site tours for small groups with a minimum of 8 people and a maximum of 16 people. In exceptional cases, it is possible to organise a double tour with a maximum of 32 people. There are also selected dates for individuals.
- + Why can't more than 16 people take part in the tour?
 - The BBT is an active construction site, there is construction traffic underground. We can only take a maximum of 2 minibuses with space for 16 people.
- +How does a double tour work?
 - In exceptional cases, double tours are possible, whereby one part of the group receives
 a project presentation in the tunnel worlds, while the other half enters the tunnel with
 2 minibuses for the construction site tour. The two groups then change places. In this
 case, the tour lasts around 3 hours.
- + What are the requirements for participating in a construction site tour?
 - Minimum age 18 years (exception: 16 years with declaration of consent and accompanied by an adult)
 - In good health and able to walk
 - Pregnant women and people with pacemakers may not join the tunnel tours





+Is this tour also suitable for children/school classes?

• It is also possible for school classes aged 16 and over to take part in a guided tour of the construction site if they have a declaration of consent and are accompanied by an adult. We offer guided tours of the Tunnel Worlds exhibition centre for younger children.

+What is the exact programme of a construction site tour?

 After a project presentation in the Tunnel Worlds exhibition centre, protective equipment (helmet, high-visibility waistcoat, boots) and a safety briefing are issued. The minibuses will then take you to the construction site in Wolf/Steinach, the entrance to the tunnel.

+What are the temperatures in the tunnel?

• The deeper we drive into the mountain, the warmer it gets. The average temperature is 21 degrees. The humidity is also very high.

+Do we need special footwear?

• We will provide you with safety boots.

+How deep into the mountain do we go?

 We drive through the access tunnel about 400 metres down into the mountain to the main tunnel tubes. In the Wolf area, a rock overburden of around 600 metres is possible.

+Are there any special safety precautions underground?

 Before you enter the tunnel with our trained BBT Guide, you will receive a safety briefing with all the details to be observed underground.

+Who is liable if something happens underground?

 Before entering the tunnel, you will fill out a disclaimer. Construction site tours are at your own risk.

+Are photography and filming allowed underground?

• Yes, both are permitted, but we ask that you always do this in a standing position, as the ground can be uneven in subterranean sites.
